Section 1	<u>Purpose</u>	
	In keeping with the District's Strategic Plan, the Board recognizes its responsibility for the development, assessment, and improvement of the educational program of the schools. To this end, the curriculum shall be evaluated, developed, and modified on a continuing basis and in accordance with a plan for curriculum improvement.	22 PA Code 4.4
Section 2	<u>Definition</u>	
	For purposes of this policy, curriculum shall be defined as a series of comprehensive, sequential, and challenging planned instruction aligned with established academic standards in each subject that is coordinated, articulated, and implemented in a manner designed to result in the achievement of each individual student to meet and exceed academic standards.	22 PA Code 4.3, 4.12 Pol. 102
Section 3	Authority	
	The Board shall be responsible for the curriculum of the District's schools. The curriculum shall be designed to provide students the opportunity to achieve and exceed the academic standards established by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the local Board of School Directors. Attaining the academic standards requires students to demonstrate the acquisition and application of knowledge, while providing opportunities for students to pursue individual interests.	22 PA Code 4.4, 4.12 Pol. 102

POLICY NO. 105 **CURRICULUM** In order to provide a quality educational program for students, 22 PA Code 4.4, the Board shall adopt a curriculum plan that includes the 4.12 requirements for courses to be taught; subjects to be taught in SC 1511, 1512 the English language; courses adapted to the age, development Pol. 107, 127 and needs of students; and strategies for assisting those students having difficulty attaining the academic standards. Section 4 Guidelines The District's curricula will be developed using a process including: professional development on best practices in the content area, standards, and pedagogy, such as Marzano's the Art and Science of Teaching; data review; review of new resources in the field; articulation within the grade level of concepts, skills, and activities; development of a vertical scope and sequence; and development of assessments aligned to standards. The District's curriculum shall provide the following: 1. Continuous learning through effective collaboration among the schools of this District. 2. Continuous access for all students to sufficient programs, Pol. 108 instructional materials and resources to support the educational program. 3. Guidance and counseling for all students to assist in Pol. 112 career and academic planning. 4. A continuum of educational programs and services for Pol. 113 all students with disabilities, pursuant to law and regulation. 22 PA Code 4.26 5. Language Instruction Educational Program for English Learner students, pursuant to law, regulation and Board Pol. 140 Policy. 6. Compensatory education programs for students, pursuant to law and regulation.
