Electronic Device Policy

Effective August 29, 2022, the Keystone Oaks School District is changing its policy regarding students' use of personal electronic devices. Students will no longer be permitted to use personal cell phones during the school day in district buildings; on district property; and during the time students are under the *supervision of the District*. Students may bring their cell phone to school, but they must remain turned off during the school day. Students may keep their cell phone in a pocket, bookbag, etc. so that they are accessible in case of an emergency, such as a lockdown or evacuation of the building. Anyone who needs to reach a student during the school day should call the main office and a member of the front office staff will ensure that the student receives the message. The main office at Keystone Oaks High School can be reached at (412) 571-6000.



Dress Guidelines

- All students entering Keystone Oaks High School are expected to strictly adhere to the Dress Guidelines. Specifics regarding the Dress Guidelines are identified below and are subject to updates:
 - No hats, head coverings, or bandanas worn, or carried in school, except for religious purposes.
 - Appropriate undergarments worn and not visible.
 - Shorts and skirts of reasonable length (midthigh).
 - No clothing displaying inappropriate messages e.g. apparel that demeans or degrades another, suggest sexual activity (innuendo) or refers to violence, alcohol, drugs or tobacco.
 - No extremely tight, loose, or revealing clothing.
 - Any tops that expose midriff, bare back, chest, or underwear.
 - Building administration and faculty have the right to question a student's dress and grooming and take necessary action if an item is not specifically stated above.
 - The building administration will make the final decision of appropriateness.

Distinguished Graduate


- Effective with the class of 2020, class rank is no longer being published on student transcripts and is only being calculated for internal purposes, such as for scholarship applications or when required by an institution.
- Starting with the class of 2023, Keystone Oaks School District will no longer recognize the top two graduates (a valedictorian and a salutatiorian). Instead, the District will recognize graduates in three categories:
 - Honors QPA 3.5-3.74
 - High Honors QPA 3.75+
 - Distinguished Graduate QPA 4.01+ and 100 or more hours of community service, a leadership position within the school or community, and less than four unexcused tardies and three unexcused absences.

 - Illness, healthcare/therapy services, quarantine, family emergency, accident recovery, court, death in the family, religious holiday, non school-sponsored trip, college visit


Attendance

 - ILL 17 years of age and under; UNX 18 years of age and older
- 10 excused absences per school year. Additional absences require an excuse from a medical professional
- School Attendance Improvement Conference
 - Held after three (3) UNX/ILL absences
 - Student & Parent/Guardian, Guidance Counselor, School Administrator
 - School Attendance Improvement Plan
- Focus on Attendance Referral
 - May be submitted after six (6) UNX/ILL absences
 - Magistrate citation
