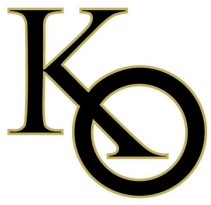

## Language Arts activities:

1. Pick a book from home or on [www.storylineonline.net](http://www.storylineonline.net). Look at the front cover and make a prediction about your book. What will it be about? What characters will be in the story? Is it a fiction or non-fiction book? After reading or listening to the story, draw and write about the setting, the characters, or your favorite part of the story.



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## Language Arts activities continued:

2. Use alphabet magnets to spell words on your refrigerator.
3. Use Play-Doh to spell words or write words in shaving cream on the kitchen table.
4. Play a rhyming game with a partner. They say a word and you have to think of a word that rhymes with theirs.
5. Play an opposites game with a partner. They say a word and you have to say the opposite.
6. Word building on a whiteboard or chalkboard. Have an adult tell you a word to write and then change one letter to make a new word. Ex: Write cat...take off the c and put on an h...what new word did you write? This can be done with beginning, middle or ending letters. Don't forget to go for a challenge. We know beginning blends & diagraphs (bl, pl, fl, sn, ch, sh, th, wh, etc.).

## Math activities:

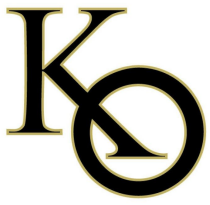
1. Practice counting to 100 by 1's, 5's & 10's.
2. Write numbers to 0-30.
3. Practice sorting into categories.
4. Make simple addition sentences using dice. Roll two dice, count the dots on each and create an addition sentence. Solve the problem.



$$6 + 4 = 10$$

1. Practice writing first and last name with proper formation

2. Practice writing all capital letters and all lowercase letters
3. Write sight words
4. Journal write either in a journal or on plain paper
  - Draw and write about your favorite season
  - Draw a picture of your family and tell about them
  - Draw and write about something you like to eat
  - Draw and write about a favorite trip you took
  - Draw and write about something you like to do inside
  - Draw and write about something you like to do outside
  - Draw and write about your favorite thing to do at school
  - Draw and write about something you miss about kindergarten
  - Draw and write anything your heart desires
